

Brownie

The current owner bought Brownie for a ranch work/pleasure horse. He wanted a kid's horse. He rode Brownie working cattle and had good luck with him. He thought would be good for kids. One day, a family friend mounted in a hurry... and was slow to move into the saddle from the stirrup. Brownie bucked/spooked. The owner also thought Brownie was involved in an accident on the way to the sale barn (before owner bought him). Trainers used so far were not the right match for Brownie.

The first visit:

Through assessment, it was revealed that Brownie would benefit from Trauma Release. A vertebral assessment also indicated his back was compromised, possibly causing him pain.

The first session we established trust, introduced the work, and performed trauma release. I worked with 'Valor' essential oil on my hands...Brownie loved Valor. What a beautiful heart! Brownie was very receptive to the work.

After the first treatment, the owner commented that he noticed improvement in Brownie's behavior and reactions. He was better with kids and others. He also went through the gate better, settling in to his new home.

Brownie second visit/session:

The owner commented he noticed improvement in behavior and reactions since last treatment. He was better with kids and others. He went through gate better, etc.

Brownie Likes Treatments! He responds so well...he even shakes his head, 'Yes.'

Assessment indicated that Brownie's back was compromised, possibly causing pain (a possible contributing reason for behavior issues). His back was compromised from the tail area, affecting the entire length of the back. Vertebral release was performed. In addition, tuning fork therapy was applied.

The owner noted continuing improvement with Brownie's behaviors.

Brownie -third visit/session

Previously, Brownie has had treatments for trauma release and vertebral release (compromised back that was potentially a source of pain). The owner commented that improvements were noticed and sustained.

The third day, we prepared Brownie to go to a new trainer. The owner also mentioned concerns with Brownie's right eye. He wonders if there is decreased vision in that eye as he had been a little jumpy if somebody was on that side.

Clearing techniques were performed with his eye. Behavior modification techniques were performed and Brownie responded well...he is ready for the trainer!

The first ride went well! The owner sent a video of Brownie's first ride at the trainer. He also commented that the eye seemed better and he was less reactive on that side.
